

Valentine's Guest Denizen, Not Citizen of 'USA Inc.'

Following are the topics and speakers featured on "Radio Free America—the talk show for intelligent Americans," hosted by Tom Valentine, which airs five nights a week on North America One, the satellite radio network.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 6

George Gordon, considered by many to be the top layman expert on the use of law and U.S. courts, was Tom Valentine's guest to open the week of Radio Free America.

When asked why he didn't become a lawyer, Gordon, who came out of the business world frustrated by federal agency law, said that he had been invited to join bar associations, but he refused, because by doing so he would become "an officer of the court."

Gordon began with a discussion of why the state feels it has the right to take children away from parents. "It's a matter of title to property," Gordon said. "The marriage license gives title to the state. We have moved from a society of Constitutional law in a patriarchal form to one of

civil law in matriarchal form."

Gordon stressed that the 14th Amendment to the Constitution provided national citizenship and effectively superceded states' rights.

Gordon cited cases to prove that Americans live under "USA Inc." He used as an example the breakdown of the family, not only socially but legally when he referred to the arrangement between the federal government and individuals as a "limited general partnership."

"We gave you 108 benefits," the government alleges as it claims its rewards with inheritance tax.

Utilizing treaty laws, which exist with various Indian tribes, Gordon chooses to be a denizen rather than a citizen. "Denizen" is an obscure legal term for one who is neither alien nor citizen, but has most of the rights of a citizen.

His business is private, not public, and he carries a passport that identifies him as a denizen.

Denizens have no political rights, but the Supreme Court has reported on the status of denizens 21 times, stressed Gordon.

Gordon succeeds with his approach because of exclusions of the law. He pointed out that exclusions have been granted to the Amish and Jehovah's Witnesses, for example.

Gordon drives with no license, no insurance and an embassy license plate. He therefore assumes a strict liability for any damages he might cause, and he promises to pay those damages in gold, which, along with silver, is the only Constitutional legal tender, he says.

He says that he has been in the courts 60 times and has won 46 times.

The U.S. Supreme Court has made special roles for the Amish, who eschew modern conveniences.

Taylor also discussed allergies, some of which he considers are often precursors to cancer. He stressed that addictions and allergies are closely related; many Americans are addicted to foods they are allergic to—coffee and chocolate being two prime examples.

Taylor is striving to replace the many offshore clinics in Tijuana, Mexico with rational and effective cancer treatment on this side of the border. He pointed out that modern medicine has admitted that the "war on cancer" is a failure, so he is looking to more effective, non-toxic and non-invasive treatments.

Tom's guest was Ed Lambert of Palm Springs, California, who is a close friend of Ron Rewald, the former CIA operating who is now languishing in the Terminal Island federal prison.
